

 Programs built on the success of partnerships with Vancouver School Board, Vancouver Public Library, and Vancouver Park Board

 Space designed to encourage collaboration and communication among users

 Art studios and exhibition and performance spaces

Improved fitness centre and sports programming

 Flexible, multi-purpose rooms for meetings and programs
